

Superformance Mk III Owners Manual Update Instructions

Inserting Update Pages

The pre-punched pages can be inserted by hand. In testing, replacing the pages took me about five minutes using the following procedure. Feedback from other manual owners indicates that it might take fifteen minutes for someone who has not done it before. If replacing the comb is too challenging, you can also remove the comb, update the pages, and take the manual to a copy shop to have the comb reinserted.

1. Remove the comb.
 - a. Lay the manual face down on a table with the comb binder hanging over the edge.
 - b. Lift the comb rings out of the manual one at a time. Gently, of course.
2. Replace the pages with the new pages included with this update.
 - a. Replace the pages one at a time. If you remove a group of pages at once, you may remove pages that are not being replaced.
 - b. When you are done, compare the removed pages to the list of replaced pages provided to see if you have removed pages that should not have been removed.
3. Replace the comb.
 - a. Arrange the manual pages in the appropriate order. Use the Manual Page Order shown below. Stack the manual carefully so that the holes are lined up.
 - b. The manual is too thick to reinsert all the comb rings in one pass. Divide the manual in half at around page 81. Start with the back half and back covers.
 - c. Lay the manual face down with the holes over the edge of the table.
 - d. Reinsert the comb rings one at a time. Working with half the manual, the comb rings should go through all the pages. The spine of the comb should be resting against the spine of the manual. Leave it there for the next step.
 - e. Flip the manual over on its back.

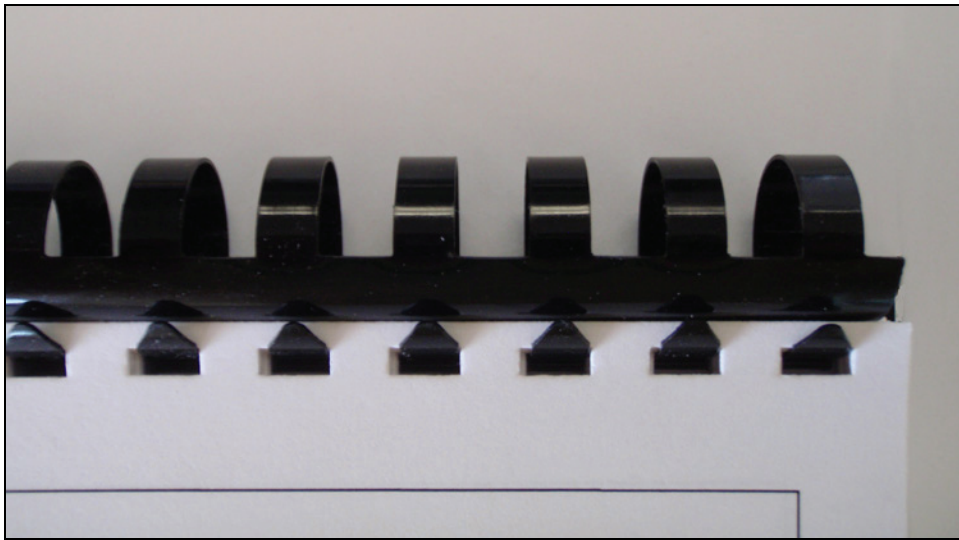


Figure 1: Rotate the spine of the comb so that it is pressed against the spine manual. Flip the manual over on its back. With the spine of the comb pressing against the spine of the manual, the teeth of the comb rings should be open about an eighth of an inch. Rotate the comb so the teeth are sticking up about a quarter of an inch or slightly less.

 - f. If it isn't already, rotate the spine of the comb so that it is pressed against the spine of the manual. See Figure 1.
 - g. With the spine of the comb pressing against the spine of the manual, the teeth of the comb rings should be open about an eighth of an inch. Rotate the comb so the teeth are sticking up about a quarter of an inch or slightly less. See Figure 1.

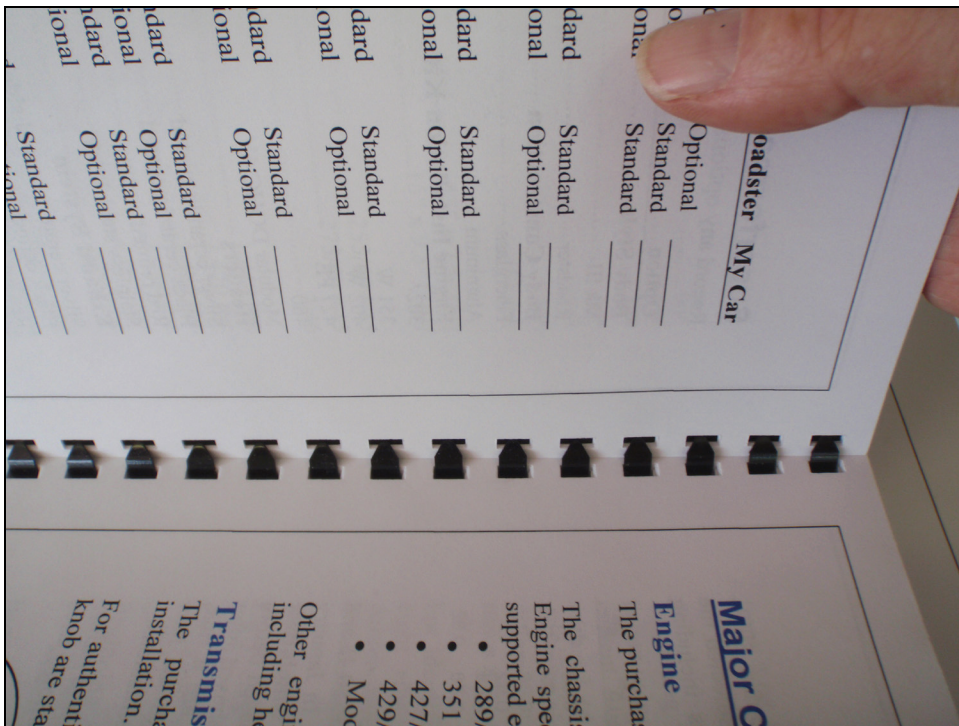


Figure 2: Stack about 10 to 20 of the remaining pages carefully and work them over the teeth and into place. Work with the pages as a unit, slipping them between the teeth and the spine together, then rotating the over the teeth together. If you need to, do it one page at a time until you get the hang of it.

 - h. Stack about 10 to 20 of the remaining pages carefully and work them over the teeth and into place. Work with the pages as a unit, slipping them between the teeth and the spine together, and then rotating them over the teeth together. If you need to, do it one page at a time until you get the hang of it. See Figure 2.
 - i. Continue this until all pages are in place. Then do the front clear cover.
 - j. Rotate the comb so that the spine of the comb is away from the spine of the manual and comb rings lay flat against the comb spine.
4. Insert into Zippered Cover

If you have the zippered cover, insert the card stock rear cover only (and not the plastic rear cover) into the pocket in the zippered cover to secure your manual. The high art rear cover is printed with xerographic technology and may stick to the zippered vinyl cover if the plastic rear cover does not separate them. If you don't have the zippered cover, the card stock rear cover can be deleted.

Manual Page Order

The page order is, top to bottom.

1. The clear **plastic front cover**.
2. The Superformance **high art front cover**. See Figure 3.
3. The **card stock front cover** with your name. Note border on front side only.
4. The manual. The **inside front cover** of the manual is unnumbered, has the red car but not your name, and has printed borders front and back. The **manual** page numbers begin with Page i and end with Page 204. The **inside back cover** of the manual is unnumbered, is blank, and has printed borders front and back.
5. The Superformance **high art back cover**. See Figure 3.
6. The clear or solid color **plastic back cover**.
7. The **card stock back cover**, no borders.

Inserting Update Pages - Illustrations
